Call for Artists

The Fraser River Discovery Centre is seeking photographers for a themed exhibit called **click* photos of the fraser*, opening September 25, 2010. We invite both amateur and professional photographers of all ages to submit images for consideration.

Exhibit Details:

Since Time Immemorial the Fraser River basin has shaped the history, environment, industry and cultures of this region. Today it is home to almost 3 million people, each with his and her own unique view of the river. **click* photos of the fraser* aims to bring together a collection of these points of view. Photographers of all ages are invited to submit photographs that capture their view of the river basin. We welcome a wide variety of visual interpretations of the topic.

**click* photos of the fraser* will be a two part exhibit: online and in the gallery. Photos submitted will be displayed online and a selection will be on display in the galleries opening September 25, 2010.

Submission Details:

Please include the following information with your submission.

- name of artist
- contact information
- title list of photographs
- Artist statement. The statement (maximum 100 words) should describe how each submitted image relates to the exhibit topic.
- Submitted images must be in .jpg format and no larger than 25MB. In addition, images must meet one of the following size requirements: a) at least 3000 pixels wide, minimum 72dpi; b) at least 2200 pixels wide, minimum 150dpi; or c) 2000 pixels wide, minimum 180dpi. Please make sure your image has a file extension of .jpg prior to uploading.
- This exhibit is open to photographic works only. Please do not submit images that are not works of photography (such as photos of paintings, screenshots, or illustrations).
- Please note that photographs **must be submitted electronically**.

Deadline for submission is Tuesday August 31, 2010 at 4:30pm.

Frequently Asked Questions

Where do I send my submission?

Please send your photographs (in .jpg format) and submission details (in word processing document) to Kathleen Bertrand, Exhibit and Communication Coordinator at kbertrand@fraserriverdiscovery.org.

If your photographs are on Flickr, you can add your photos directly to the group at www.flickr.com/groups/clickphotosofthefraser.

My file is really big, how can I send my submission by email?

You can create a free account at www.yousendit.com to send files up to 100MB. Please remember to limit each photo file to 25MB and to send a separate email with the required submission details.

What is the difference between the online exhibit and the gallery exhibit?

For the online portion of the exhibit, images will be uploaded to the Fraser River Discovery Centre's Flickr site and available for the public to view and comment on. For the gallery portion of the exhibit, a selection of photographs from the Flickr site will be printed and installed in the gallery.

How will you decide which photographs will be selected?

We will upload photographs to our Flickr site from which we will print up a selection of photographs for the gallery installation. The selection process for printing will be determined by the response the photos receive on Flickr. Both the quantity and quality of comments will be taken into account. The final number of images to be printed in the gallery will depend on number of submissions and gallery space. *We will do our best to include all submissions, however we reserve the right to select images for both the online and gallery portion of the exhibit.*

What will you do to prevent my work from being copied?

Your high resolution file will not be uploaded to the Flickr site and restrictions will be placed on downloading. You will retain copyright of your images and the Fraser River Discovery Centre will not reproduce any image without your consent.
